GEO's 20th Year is Off to a Great Start! \$2,150,000 Received In First Two Months of

Dear Friends:

I know I just sent you an email earlier this week so why a second one so quickly? We just received great news today that our new school in Gary received a \$900,000 startup grant. That's why. There were 23 applicants for this competitive grant and we were among the nine schools selected to receive the grant. Wow!

These dollars will help us buy desks, chairs, computers, software, hire and train staff, recruit students and much more. All I can say is WOW!!!

So, after getting this news, I had to sit back and reflect just a bit this morning and remind myself that this is GEO's 20th year of operation. That is hard to believe! 20 years!

We started out in my living room as an advocacy organization for school choice. We still support and advocate for school choice, but today, instead of buying radio, tv and newspaper ads, or writing op-eds and putting together rallies for school choice at the state house, we practice school choice by providing it in communities where it is desperately needed.—Gary, Indiana, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and Colorado Springs, Colorado. We currently serve 2500 students in these three cities and will serve 3,000 this August. I always tell friends, "Unfortunately, business is good. If we weren't needed, we wouldn't be in business." We are needed in Baton Rouge, Gary and Colorado Springs and now other cities are calling, too. We will see what we can do in other areas of the country but our focus will always be on making sure our schools are HIGH QUALITY. We do not seek to have hundreds of schools, rather, we seek to have HIGH QUALITY schools. The students we serve deserve nothing but the best from us and our focus must be on the students we serve, not on growing an empire of a bunch of low to medium quality schools.

In any case, this is our 20th year and we are off to an AMAZING start. In January and February, we received \$1 million to help us buy a building in Baton Rouge that will help us serve 500 students this August. We received another \$250,000 to help us with this same effort. In February, we purchased a building to start our new school in Gary. And today, we earned a \$900,000 grant to help start that school off on the right foot. Just wow!

The picture on the left down below shows the kind of parent support we receive at our schools and the picture on the right is perhaps the most illustrative of our results and our mission—beating poverty! Nyesha Canady is a 2014 alum of 21st Century Charter in Gary. She earned her Associate Degree while in our high school and then graduated from Ball State in 2016 debt free. She now teaches in our school and has earned enough and has enough financial security to buy her own car. She has financial security, health and retirement benefits and is off to a great life. That's what this is all about. Pretty cool!

I wonder what the rest of the year will look like.
