From: The Eco-Friendly Mobile Farm Stand Project, a 501(c)(3) organization

I hope all is well,

I am writing to see if any of you might have time for a phone call regarding a program called The Eco-Friendly Mobile Farm Stand Project. We are a non-profit whose mission is to set up and provide gas-free and emissions-free transportation to organizations that serve urban food deserts. Our goal is to be part of the transportation solution to the food desert/hunger issue in an eco-friendly way by using street-legal, low-speed, electric mobile farm stands.

No matter the organization's source for the fruits and vegetables -- local distributor, food pantry, grocery store or community farm, The Eco-Friendly Mobile Farm Stand Project simply wants to help take healthy fruits and vegetables from A to B -- senior living facilities, housing communities, schools or just like an ice cream truck, make stops in various neighborhoods -- anywhere citizens might not be able to get to a healthy food source because of distance, age, lack of funds, lack of transportation or a disability.

We are currently planning a program with Gary's FAITH Farms and Orchard in collaboration with The Center for Urban and Regional Excellence at IU Northwest and are looking for a partner(s) to adopt a vehicle for the project. A one-time, lifetime vehicle adoption is \$16,500. The adoption fee covers base vehicle cost, charging system, farm stand design/build-out and graphics (executed by local Gary trade school students) and on-going program administration. The name and/or logo of the vehicle adopter will be prominently placed on the farm stand for permanent recognition as a partner in helping aleve the food desert/hunger issue -- in an environmentally friendly way.
